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
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# President's Message

and coworkers. You must have balance to have a complete life.



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# **ODE Update**

The Office for Child Nutrition strives to present updated and helpful information to all schools about child nutrition programs in Ohio and continues to focus on customer service. Schools should receive a response within 24 hours when asking a question about feeding Ohio's children. This article announces the breakfast grant awardees, offers information for another equipment grant opportunity, and includes upcoming trainings.

Breakfast is important and our goal is to feed more kids! Approximately fifty schools will receive awards totaling almost \$500,000 from the Ohio Department of Education's School Breakfast Grant.

Last March, the American Dairy Association Mid-East offered a school breakfast grant. Schools applied and showed a real need for more equipment to help increase breakfast participation. This school year, the Ohio Department of Education was able to assist and help fill the need!

More than 290 school food authorities submitted grant applications to the department's Office for Child Nutrition. The funds will assist with equipment to facilitate the alternative breakfast model (e.g., insulated bags, carts, kiosks, garbage bags, trash cans, wireless POS machines, etc.), kitchen equipment to help increase food quality (freezers, refrigerators, storage, etc.), nutrition education materials, and advertising materials to promote the breakfast program and increase student participation.



# SNA Identifies Top Training Needs for School Nutrition Professionals

SNA is stepping up to help school nutrition professionals meet USDA's Professional Standards training requirements. The association recently partnered with four state agencies to conduct a comprehensive online assessment to identify the top training needs of school nutrition professionals at the director, manager and employee levels. SNA members can click here to access the executive summary of the report and learn more about the training topics that school nutrition professional seek most.

Key findings from the assessment revealed that staff management and development topics, such as team building and time management, are a top training area of interest for all school nutrition professionals. School nutrition directors also indicated interest in marketing, financial management and procurement training. Food production, culinary skills and customer service are training topics that directors and managers seek for their school and kitchen staff, while managers and employees also requested training in nutrition, menu planning and meal pattern regulations.

SNA membership offers a number of professional development opportunities through SNA webinars, conferences, the award-winning School Nutrition magazine, and certificate and credentialing programs. 
- Be supportive of nutrition services

# Guidelines For Scholarship Awards

- SNA of Ohio will award annual scholarships to persons who are pursuing an education in a food service area or nutrition area or other professional development, including certification or credentialing.
- SNA of Ohio members will be considered before non-members for available scholarships.
- The number of scholarships granted each year will depend on the balance in the scholarship fund and the number of qualified applicants.
- Scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$500. The deadline for applying is May 1st of each year. Winners will be recognized at the annual conference. The scholarship is effective for one year, beginning June 1 of the year to May 31st of the proceeding year.
- A person may win a scholarship for three years. If sufficient funding exists, qualified applicants could be considered for a 4th year.
- The scholarships will be issued to the winners by SNA of Ohio after receipts for books and/or tuition are turned into SNA of Ohio's Executive Director.
- The Scholarship Chair will appoint a committee if there is sufficient applicants to judge who may be awarded a scholarship.

# BARBARA DUNCAN PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP


