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

Next on the meetings' agenda, Chapter president Jackie Hess introduced Elaine Brock, a member of the Lake Erie Shores #21 Blue Star Mothers. Meeting guests were given information about the Blue Star Mother's chapters and what some of their great projects in the community are to help support our military troops and families. Jan Diamond from the American Dairy Association presented to the group about the Ohio School Breakfast

Challenge, and urged school staff members to think of creative ways to increase breakfast participation. There are numerous awards pertaining to the challenge including increasing your participation by 30%.

The next session of the meeting covered several areas of the school lunch program including quality standards, portioning control, kitchen hazards and accident prevention in the workplace. Linda Miller from Perkins Schools and Shelly Geason from Edison Schools combined with Sue Whitaker to present to the group on the familiar topics and worked through several worksheets with the attendees.

The evenings' dinner was sponsored and served by Bev Angne and Michelle Verdell from ACOSTA, Roger Doseck from JTM, along with Charley Miller from Rational and retired GFS representative Terry Diso. Sue thanked all of the sponsors for the wonderful dinner and all of their hard work in supporting our food service programs.

Chapter President Jackie Hess called the Chapter 22 business meeting to order and asked Secretary/Treasurer Shelly Geason to take roll call of the attending chapter members and read the current Treasurer's report. 

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# **Office for Child Nutrition**

The Office for Child Nutrition continues to present updated and helpful information to all schools about child nutrition programs in Ohio and continues to focus on customer service. Schools should receive a response within 24 hours when asking a question about feeding Ohio's children. This article announces the breakfast grant awardees, offers information for another equipment grant opportunity, and includes upcoming trainings.

## Whole Grain-Rich and Milk Type Exemptions:

Applications for the exemptions are available on the ODE food waiver webpage and must be approved before the school can incorporate modifications into school meals. School Food Authorities (SFA) with a previously submitted and approved whole-grain rich exemption do not need to reapply since the waiver approval carries over into the 2017-2018 school year.

#### 2017 Buy American Task Force:

We are excited to announce a new 29-person Buy American Task Force (BATF). The task force represents all American Commodity Distribution Association (ACDA) memberships and uses the United States Department of Agriculture's <u>SP38-2017</u> for guidance. The task force meets monthly and members are excited to bring diversity and grassroots issues to the forefront of the discussion. The task force will assist ACDA members to understand the Buy American policy requirements. It realizes that industry members have strong concerns about these requirements. Much of this feedback stems from the lost sales to imported products sold at cheaper prices in absence of a formal Buy American waiver process.

With the other food purchasing authorities present – either at the state or local level – there is a frustration with insufficient increases in meal reimbursements coupled with a perceived requirement to purchase more expensive foods. The production areas

are more likely to be concerned about Buy American than non-production areas. Although we can address each of these issues and more, it is the task force's position to prioritize and accomplish its goals.

The task force established that its mission is to assist ACDA members in an ongoing understanding of and compliance with the statutory and regulatory Buy American requirements for school meal programs. The task force is underway and knows that this policy impacts all ACDA members.

The task force's top five list includes:

- The Buy American policy has ambiguity and confusion. All membership areas express this concern. The committee will dissect these issues and develop answers to frequently asked questions to assist ACDA members.
- 2) There are higher costs associated with the Buy American policy and a concern about producers not being able to meet national demands.
- 3) A more formal template and guidance is needed through training.
- There are procurement challenges when required to take the lowest bidder.
- 5) The ACDA conference and other national conferences will provide training. Details forthcoming.

This task force is dedicated to accomplishing its goals and finding solutions on behalf of all ACDA stakeholders. I am proud to represent the task force and serve as its chair to help craft clear and efficient guidance.

#### **Buy American Compliance:**

The office received several inquiries regarding Buy American compliance, specifically related to items not grown domestically or when domestic food purchase is truly not practical. USDA policy memo SP 38-2017 Compliance with and Enforcement of the Buy American Provision explains limited exceptions to the Buy American

provision. If a School Food Authority (SFA) is using one of the exceptions, there is no requirement to request a waiver from the Office for Child Nutrition to purchase a non-domestic product. SFAs **must**, however, keep documentation justifying their use of exception(s). Review the policy memo for additional details. Our office is always happy to answer questions to those needing assistance.

In addition to new language and regulations, we want to clarify the term "Universal Free Meals." Please note that "universal free" is not a term USDA recognizes in regulation. If school food authorities (SFAs) elect not to charge any student for a meal and are not participating in Provision 2 or Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), the school must supplement the non-profit food service account with funding to cover the cost of producing the meals for paid students. The school is permitted to use the non-profit food service account to cover the cost of reduced-price meals.

SFAs electing not to charge paid students for meals must cover the cost of paid student meals from another funding source. SFAs in this situation should consider participating in Provision 2 or CEP next school year. Should you have questions, contact our office and we can direct you to an education program specialist.

These schools will receive an All-Star recognition banner to proudly display in their school. Banners will be distributed at summer conferences.

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












# Spotlight on Young Professionals


#### Field Trip

#### **SNA's 2017 School Nutrition Trends Report**

SNA released its 2017 School Nutrition Trends Report, a summary of findings from a survey conducted with SNA members. The report contains information on menu trends related to student customization, flavor trends and clean label ingredients. 60% of responding districts are offering new menu items that feature international flavors, 56% report serving cleaner label choices and over half offer made-to-order or self-serve entrée bars! The survey also revealed that school nutrition professionals have employed a wide range of tactics to meet sodium and whole grain regulations, but continue to face challenges and express concerns about meeting those particular mandates. 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

### **Guidelines For Scholarship Awards**

- SNA of Ohio will award annual scholarships to persons who are pursuing an education in a food service area or nutrition area or other professional development, including certification or credentialing.
- SNA of Ohio members will be considered before non-members for available scholarships.
- The number of scholarships granted each year will depend on the balance in the scholarship fund and the number of qualified applicants.
- Scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$500. The deadline for applying is May 1st of each year. Winners will be recognized at the annual conference. The scholarship is effective for one year, beginning June 1 of the year to May 31st of the proceeding year.
- A person may win a scholarship for three years. If sufficient funding exists, qualified applicants could be considered for a 4th year.
- The scholarships will be issued to the winners by SNA of Ohio after receipts for books and/or tuition are turned into SNA of Ohio's Executive Director.
- The Scholarship Chair will appoint a committee if there is sufficient applicants to judge who may be awarded a scholarship.


